# RADM Scott W. Pappano

# **Program Executive Office Strategic Submarines**

Rear Admiral Scott Pappano is a native of Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. He is a 1989 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy with a Bachelor of Science in Marine Engineering and holds a Master of Science in Nuclear Engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. At sea, Pappano served aboard USS City of Corpus Christi (SSN 705), USS Albuquerque (SSN 706), USS Michigan (SSBN 727) (Gold), and USS Ohio (SSGN 726). He commanded USS Buffalo (SSN 715) while forward deployed in Guam.

Assignments ashore include duty with Commander, Submarine Development Squadron 12 Tactical Action Group; onboard X-Daniel Webster (MTS 626) at Naval Nuclear Power Training Unit Charleston, South Carolina, military assistant to the Assistant Secretary of Defense for International Security Policy; and executive assistant to the Director, Programming Division (N80) on the Navy Staff.

After selection as an acquisition professional, he served in the Special Operations Forces Mobility Program Office (PMS 399); as executive assistant to Commander, Naval Sea Systems Command; and as major program manager for the Strategic and Attack Submarine Program Office (PMS 392). RADM Pappano was assigned as program executive officer, strategic submarines in October 2021. His previous flag assignments include Commander, Naval Undersea Warfare Center and Director, Comprehensive Test Facility and program executive officer, Columbia.

Pappano served on teams that have been awarded the Joint Meritorious Unit Award, Navy Unit Commendation, Meritorious Unit Commendation, and the Navy "E" Ribbon.

The Base CDR read the above biography and introduced the Rear Admiral, who spoke without a script or projector. His remarks included the following, and we left out the later "Chatham House Rules" part of his discussion, per his request.

This is a very unstable and unknown world out there today. We have the United States and two other great powers out there. (China and Russia). This is much like the verge of WW II in 1938 where we had crazy people in Germany and Japan. Are we ready? We are ready but we need to be more ready.

Strategic nuclear power works. It is the bedrock of our defense and deterrence. 70% of our country's warheads are on the SSBNs.

The Ohio class of SSBNs were built for 30 years of service. We have now stretched some of them out to 42 years. Only the USS Kamehameha (SSBN 642) has lasted that long.

We have to have 10 SSBN's strategically loaded out at all times. We are looking at seven Ohio Class life extension programs to remain viable. The SSGNs (Ohio, Michigan, Florida, and Georgia) will be cannibalized soon to keep the others going.

"Pray for Peace, but Prepare for War" is our job. The pacing threat is in the Pacific – it is China. It will be maritime war. The Chinese plan to put our carriers and our carrier task forces at risk first. Our submarines will be the pointed end of the spear in the Pacific for any war with China.

Building more submarines faster is an industrial base issue. The government was not strategic about the submarine industrial base. We need both a work force development effort and a technology insertion effort. We also need to outsource the building of some less complex modules for the submarine shipyards to get to better build rates in the future.

### **In a question and answer period**, we heard:

Q – Compare the US vs. the Russian and Chinese submarines. The Russian subs are as good as we are, but the Chinese are excellent at stealing stuff from us. They have loads of shipyards. They learn very quickly.

In 1938, President Roosevelt started a massive shipbuilding program before the WW II entrance by the US. This shipbuilding ramp up helped us to win in the Pacific. Today, the federal

government can spend \$ 40 Billion as a gift to Ukraine, and it can spend \$ 1Trillion on infrastructure. Where is the federal government's money for shipbuilding?
