NEW BUSINESS

"DUES ANNOUNCEMENT FROM NATIONAL:

As we are all aware, inflation and cost of living increases have raised the cost of everything. In the last three years alone, because of increases in paper, printing, and mailing, costs for our American Submariner Magazine have gone up 25%. Another of our major expenses is travel, and in the last three years, the mileage reimbursement costs have gone from \$.40 cents per mile to \$.65 cents per mile. In order to offset some of these expenses, we find it necessary to raise our annual dues by \$5.00, from \$25.00 per year to \$30.00 per year. Our new dues structure will be as follows: National Term (Annual) Dues

5-Year Term: Increase from \$115.00 to \$140.00

3-Year Term: Increase from \$ 70.00 to \$85.00

1-Year Term: (Jan thru Dec) Increase from \$25.00 to \$30.00

For members joining in the last quarter of the year, 1 Year Term is \$5.00 (Oct thru

Dec) plus \$30.00 for the follow-on year (Jan thru Dec) for a total of \$35.00.

National Life Dues

Ages 76 and older: Increase from \$100.00 to \$120.00

Ages 66 thru 75: Increase from \$200.00 to \$240.00

Ages 56 thru 65: Increase from \$300.00 to \$360.00

Ages 46 thru 55: Increase from \$400.00 to \$500.00

Ages 45 and younger: Increase from \$500.00 to \$600.00

• This increase will go into effect on 1 April 2023, at which time updated application forms will be posted and the PPM updated."

The Treasurer noted that if you decide to upgrade to a Lifetime membership, you will be

credited for your annual 2023 National dues so the amount will be reduced by \$25.00. Contact him for more information on how to execute an upgrade.

SUBMARINE HISTORY

This history presentation was developed using text from the U.S.S. BARBEL (SS-316) first war patrol report available at the link https://issuu.com/hnsa/docs/ss-316_barbel, page 13. The Commanding Officer was Commander R.A. Keating.

After an early morning surface attack on a convoy, BARBEL submerged to evade detection and was basically "held down" by DD's and aircraft for the rest of the day. BARBEL had a major problem with leaking periscope packing when at deep depths. The following is a reading of the patrol report for the rest of that day.

"9 August 1944.

1922

DD has doubtful contact on us. Water isothermal to 260 feet, then ragged to 360, giving a 8 degree drop, then isoballast from there on down. We have been down 16 hours now, the battery is low, the air is bad, and all hands are pretty-well exhausted. We reduced the auxiliary load to an absolute minimum, spread CO2 absorbent, running in hand power, one third speed (except once when we went standard to keep from dropping out of sight forever, and until enough water had been pumped out). Our trim pump is exceptionally quiet, and very effective. Periscope packing leaks dangerously, and since depth charging, we have developed an extremely noisy vibration around the periscope shears that becomes apparent at 55 turns.

Two ships have us pretty-well boxed in - we kept fishtailing, keeping the stern towards the nearest one, and keeping between him and TORI SHIMA, to take advantage of the land background noise. They seemed very reluctant to continue the search to the eastward, evidently searching our position circles from the attack point.

2025

It appeared that one ship was still astern, not pinging, but patrolling back and forth at a constant speed, listening, and waiting for us to surface. We were in pretty bad shape, CO₂ 3%, Hydrogen 3%, the battery getting lower, and all hands getting more exhausted. Offered a fervent prayer to God to turn the Jap east.

2100

Screws fading out to the eastward. Started up.

2136

At radar depth – all clear under 8000 yards.

2137

Surfaced on course 315T, all ahead frantic, one main and the auxiliary engine on charge, three mains on propulsion. Secured from battle stations, piped to a hot meal (the first in 26 hours).

2210

Slowed to full power."
