SUBMARINE HISTORY

USS Shark (SS-174) First Patrol Report

The presentation today is based upon USS SHARK SS-174 first patrol report that was forwarded to the Commander Submarines, ASIATIC FLEET on 23 December 1941.

SHARK got underway from Manila and as described in the report:

"Area - Enroute to Santa Cruz Harbor, Marinduque, P.I. and return."

"A. On 9 December 1941 proceeded to Mariveles Harbor and anchored between the mine fields, outside the submarine net, one-half hour after sunset. At 1900 a large Army searchlight was observed to be sending plain language signals to a DD patrol off Corregidor telling her the names and times of departure of submarines leaving Manila Bay the night of 9 December."

"At 2030 got underway and stood out of the minefield channel. The buoys were illuminated by Army searchlight. Upon clearing minefield channel proceeded directly to the VERDE ISLAND PASSAGE at 12.5 knots on 2 main engines, passing two miles inside of FORTUNE ISLAND and two miles outside of CAPE SANTIAGO."

SHARK arrived at Santa Cruz harbor at dusk on 10 December and anchored 800 yards from SANTA CRUZ LIGHT bearing 290° T.

On 11 December, at 0354 SHARK received a message indicating that sixteen enemy transports were in TABAYAS BAY and ordered attack. Radio had difficulty in receiving this message and could not decipher address, but assumed it was intended for SHARK. So at 0420 SHARK got underway. SHARK conducted a sweep of the area with no results so returned to the SANTA CRUZ LIGHT area and anchored sometime on 12 December.

"At 1245, 13 December, a small steamer flying Philippine flag stood in to harbor. Replied to hail that it was from BATANGAS, "coming home". "At 1400 hailed a native fisherman in a fishing banca "(outrigger) "and using the steward as an interpreter informed him of the war. In answer to questions the fisherman stated that there were no white people on Marinduque. Sent fisherman into the town to send out the Mayor. At 1630 a dilapidated outboard motor boat stood out from the town bring the mayor and a retinue of fifteen. Several spoke excellent English. Obtained the following information from this group: (1) There are two or three Japs in Marinduque, all are now in the BOAC jail. One, the owner of the gold (iron) mine, had a short wave transmitter in his house as well as numerous maps. The informants were vague about the nature of the maps. (2) There is no diesel fuel on the island and very little gasoline. SHARK gave the natives all the gasoline remaining on board, about 110 gallons. (3) The only flat surfaces suitable for landing fields are at present rice paddies. (This from the Mayor). (4) Some fruit (bananas, limes, papayas), and some chickens, eggs and pigs can be bought. (5) The only arms on the island are a few .32 pistols in the possession of the police and a very few rounds of ammunition. (6) The police force is estimated at 10 to 20 men. (7) There is a cable to LUCENA and a radio transmitter on the island. Location not learned, but believed to be BOAC. (8) A blackout is maintained, except for occasional open fires in the hills. (9) There are a number of sailing boats and one or two motor boats at SANTA CRUZ.

At 1700 sent a man in Mayor's boat to turn off SANTA CRUZ LIGHT. This is an acetylene light and natives were instructed as to manner of relighting it."

On 17 December SHARK purchased eggs, chickens, fruit and dressed pigs from natives. SHARK also sent laundry ashore. On 19 December SHARK received orders to return to MANILA.

Wonder if they got their laundry back.
